Job description

The aim of this role is to:

1. Build networks of Noam (Masorti Youth) alumni and other young adults connected to Masorti communities or who are interested in the Masorti approach to Judaism;
2. Create connections with them by engaging them in relational meetings (1-to-1s and house meetings), social media, sessions with Masorti rabbis and events;
3. Raise funds for Noam by running campaigns aimed at the alumni network and wider Noam community.

Responsibilities and duties

1. Developing the Noam alumni and Masorti young adult networks
 - Gathering and managing data on members using Beacon CRM
 - Developing a communications plan for website, email and social media channels
 - Creating and publishing regular communications by email and social media
 - Collating information about relevant activities in Masorti communities and sharing it with the networks on a regular basis
 - Building relationships between network members and Masorti rabbis by encouraging meetings, co-creating events and developing online content
 - Coordinating listening campaigns across the networks and carrying out at least five one-to-ones or small group meetings per week
 - Strengthening networks and engagement by designing and running social, educational, religious, volunteering or fundraising events
2. Creating and running Noam fundraising campaigns
 - Managing the Noam supper quiz
 - Creating and running an annual Noam alumni fundraising campaign
 - Supporting the Noam tzevet to create and manage online and sponsored Noam fundraising campaigns
 - Working with a fundraising consultant to ensure the effectiveness of these campaigns
3. Professional development
 - We will expect and support you to invest in your own professional development by taking part in training courses, mentoring or coaching, and networking with charity sector professionals

4. Other responsibilities

- Communications, administrative and CRM support for Masorti Judaism events and fundraising
- Attending regular team meetings
- Other duties as required
